



100 YEARS AT 50 WEST

From *The New York Herald, New York Tribune*, August 28, 1924:

Miss Olive Wyndham [writes]: "I never thought I would be one to write letters such as this..."

50 West Sixty-Seventh Street.

From *New York Times*, May 15, 1925:

Olive Wyndham, the actress, was married yesterday at the home of her mother, 50 West Sixty-seventh Street.... The bride has appeared in many Broadway productions, including "The Magic Melody," "The Man From Home," "Strife," "The Green Goddess," "Thin Ice" and, most recently, "The Steam Roller." Miss Wyndham was attended by her sister, Janet Beecher, also a well-known actress.... The bride will not retire from the stage....
