- January 27, 1960 Downtown Lower Manhattan Association recommends
 Governors direct Port Authority to study feasibility
 of WTC, making recommendation that one be constructed.
 March 10, 1961 Port Authority completes study and submits it to

 Governors and Mayor Wagner, finding: WTC would be
 a good thing, WTC would be economically feasible,
 only a public agency could undertake project.
- 3. March 20, 1961 New York Legislature passes "package" WTC-H&M bill.

- 5. August 28, 1961 A-768 submitted to N.J. Assembly leadership (WTC section similar to that passed by New York, H&M section would permit Legislature by itself to direct Port Authority to extend H&M).

 - WTC and H&M might be physically merged on West Side.
 Various meetings with Commissioners, Governors, aides, etc. All enthusiastic over consolidation.
- 7. January 29, 1962 Identical legislation introduced in both houses of N.J. Legislature for H&M-WTC, including bond restriction.
- 8. February 9, 1962 Public hearing on legislation.
 - 9. February 13, 1962 Both N.J. houses pass bill, no negative votes. Gov. Hughes signs.
 - 10. February 15, 1962 Identical bills also identical to N.J., introduced in N.Y. Legislature.
 - 11. February 28, 1962 N.Y. State Senate passes legislation.
 - 12. March 4, 1962 Downtown West Businessmen's Association files memorandum with N.Y. Legislature opposing legislation (DWBA first meeting February 14).
 - 13. March 6, 1962 N.Y. State Assembly passes legislation.
 - 14. March 7, 1962 Companion bills passes. All N.Y. passage completed.
 - 15. March 27, 1962 Governor Rockefeller signs bill.
 - 16. June 26, 1962 DWBA institutes lawsuit to block WTC-H&M.
 - 17. July 9, 1962 Justice Chimera denies injunction to stop WTC.
 Greenbaum, et al, appeal his denial to Appellate
 Division.
 - September 1, 1962 Title on H&M vests in Port Authority.
 September 13, 1962 Board authorized retention of Minoru Yamasaki & Associates and Emery Roth & Sons as architects for The World Trade

Center.

- 19. November 29, 1962 Appellate Division hears oral arguments on case.
- 20. February 19, 1963 Appellate Division holds legislation unconstitutional by 3-2 vote.
- 21. February 28, 1963 Oral argument before Court of Appeals.
- 22. April 4, 1963 Court of Appeals upholds constitutionality of legislation, 6-1.
- 23. June 27, 1963 Greenbaum files appeal with United States Supreme Court.
- 24. September 19, 1963 PA files brief with Supreme Court.
- 25. October 9, 1963 Greenbaum files brief with Supreme Court.
- November 12, 1963 Supreme Court refuses appeal on grounds no substantial Federal question is involved.
