EMERY ROTH & SONS 850 THIRD AVENUE NEW YORK, NEW YORK

Emery Roth & Sons has designed some 60 of Manhattan's most important buildings since the end of World War II. The firm was founded in 1903 by the late Emery Roth, father of Julian and Richard. Emery Roth designed structures which have become New York landmarks. They include the Ritz Tower Hotel, the St. Moritz Hotel, the Fifth Avenue Hotel and the Hotel St. George. Among the firm's recent structures are the 43-story Sperry Rand Building at 1290 Avenue of the Americas; the 38-story office building at 80 Pine Street; the 34-story 750 Third Avenue building; the 32-story Pfizer Building at 235 East 42nd Street; the 28-story Bankers Trust Company Building at 280 Park Avenue; and the 22-story Diamond Match Building at 733 Third Avenue. The firm also was the architect for the 58-story Pan American Building at Grand Central Terminal. Among its notable achievements outside of Manhattan are the twin office buildings at 2 and 3 Penn Center Plaza in Philadelphia; the Massachusetts State Office Building in Boston; and 100 Constitution Plaza in Hartford.

Recipient of the Henry Hering Medal of the National Sculpture Society, Emery Roth & Sons also has been awarded the Apartment House Award of the American Institute of Architects' New York Chapter; the Silver Medal of the Downtown Manhattan Association; the Fifth Avenue Association's certificate for the design of 430 Park Avenue; and two awards of the New York State Association of Architects -- for the Massachusetts State Office Building, and for Tower East, an apartment house at 190 East 72nd Street, New York City.

Julian Roth was born in New York City in 1902. He attended Columbia University, and in 1926 joined his father's firm as a specification writer and

building department liaison. He became a partner in 1932 when the firm's name was changed to Emery Roth & Sons. Mr. Roth is in charge of all business matters for the firm, and is an acknowledged authority on building costs, materials and construction project budgeting.

Mr. Roth is Chairman of the Building Industry Practices Committee of the New York Building Congress, and a member of the Legislation Committee of The Real Estate Board of New York, Inc. He is the author of "BUILD OR BUY," a book on construction. Mr. Roth is married and lives in New York City. He also has a home in Brewster, New York.

Richard Roth, A.I.A., also a native New Yorker, was born in 1904. He received the degree of Bachelor of Science in Architecture from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1928. He joined the firm that year as a draftsman, and became a partner in 1932. During World War II, he served with the United States Navy as a Lieutenant Commander in charge of a Naval Construction Battalion ("Seabees") in the South Pacific. He holds the Bronze Star. Mr. Roth is in charge of design, and is the final arbiter on all plans produced by his firm. He is President of the Architects Council of New York City, Chairman of the Education Committee of the New York State Association of Architects, past president of the New York Society of Architects, and a member of the American Institute of Architects. He is the author of "YOUR FUTURE IN ARCHITECTURE."

Mr. Roth lives in New York City and also has a home in Purchase, New York. He is married and has 2 sons, Richard Jr. and Emery Roth II. Richard Jr., a graduate architect from the University of Miami in Ohio, represents the third generation in the firm.
